I. <u>Confirmation of Minutes</u> (P.C. 35/2020 Revised)

1. The Revised Draft Minutes of the 144th Council Meeting held on 29 July

2020 were circulated to Members on 24 November 2020. As there were no further requests for amendments, the Revised Draft Minutes of the meeting were taken as read, confirmed and signed by the Chairman.

2. said that the Council approved by circulation on 18 September 2020 paper P.C. 36/2020 for HKPC to extend the 50% concessionary offer to Hong Kong SMEs including start-ups for another 6 months from 1 October 2020 till 31 March 2021 as a special relief measure during the pandemic, further to the endorsement by the Finance Committee by circulation on 4 September 2020.

(B) <u>Update on Follow-up Actions on Reports of Director of Audit and Public Accounts Committee (PAC) of Legislative Council on HKPC</u>

- 3. <u>Members</u> noted the report by that HKPC had completed the implementation of all the follow-up actions on the Director of Audit's Report. As for the additional follow-up actions on the subsequent PAC Report, they had also been implemented.
- 4. <u>Members</u> also noted that HKPC was conducting a Voice of Industry consultation exercise to address the PAC Report's recommendation for the Innovation and Technology Bureau (ITB) and Innovation and Technology Commission (ITC) to regularly keep in view the mode of operation, future business direction and subvention mode of HKPC.

(C) Update on Socio-Economic Study

5. said that the external consultant appointed to assess the socio-economic impact of HKPC's work was also supporting the Voice of Industry consultation exercise (paragraph 4 above).

III. <u>Programme and Estimates of HKPC for 2021/22 and Three-Year Forecast 2021/22 – 2023/24 of HKPC Income and Expenditure (P.C. 38/2020)</u>

7. Invited by the Chairman to introduce the paper, said that the Programme and Estimates for 2021/22 were premised on the Three-Year Strategic Plan for 2021/22-2023/24 approved by the Council at its 144th meeting held on 29 July 2020. HKPC would continue to provide signature support in reindustrialisation, advanced manufacturing and smart living during 2021/22 to

2023/24 as set out in the Strategic Plan. Should the on-going Voice of Industry consultation exercise yield recommendations which had implications for the activity plan for 2021/22, the Council would be duly consulted before implementing the recommendations from the exercise.
