I. <u>Confirmation of Minutes</u> (P.C. 28/2022 Revised)

1. The Revised Draft Minutes of the 150th Council meeting held on 27 July 2022 were circulated to Members on 16 November 2022. As there were no further requests for amendments, the Revised Draft Minutes of the meeting were taken as read, confirmed and signed by the Chairman.

II. Matter Arising

(A) Paper Circulations Since Last Meeting

2. reported paper circulations to Members since the last Council meeting held on 27 July 2022:

- (a) extension of the 50% concessionary offer to Hong Kong SMEs for another 6 months till 31 March 2023 as a special relief measure under the challenging economic environment (P.C. 30/2022), which was approved by Members by circulation on 28 September 2022; and
- (c) a half-yearly report on programme area distribution of fee-charging integrated learning courses commenced in 2022/23 for Members' information (P.C. 31/2022).

VII. <u>Programme and Estimates of HKPC for 2023/24 and Three-Year</u> <u>Forecast 2023/24-2025/26 of HKPC Income and Expenditure</u> (P.C. 36/2022)

27. Invited by the Chairman to introduce the paper, <u>ED</u> said that the Game Plan approved by the Council at its 150th meeting held on 27 July 2022 would continue to be pursued in the next 3 years. This was based on the consideration that the 6 strategic directions under the Game Plan were still highly relevant to industry needs and in line with Government policy directions. The 6 strategic directions were "Intelligent Manufacturing", "Re-industrialisation - Made in Hong Kong" as renamed from "Re-industrialisation", "Smart and Green Living", "FutureSkills", "Digitalisation and Cyber Security" as well as "SME and Start-up Support".

Financial Estimates for 2023/24 and Forecast for 2023/24-2025/26

28. then took Members through the financial estimates for 2023/24 and forecast for 2023/24-2025/26.

Staff Establishment for 2023/24

30. briefed Members on the proposed staff establishment for 2023/24. The manning for the Automotive Platforms and Application Systems R&D Centre (APAS) would remain unchanged at 33.

2022/23 Targets for Key Performance Indicators

31. then took Members through the proposed Key Performance Indicator (KPI) targets for 2023/24 (Appendix 14 of paper).

- 32. After discussion, <u>Members</u> approved:
- (a) HKPC's Three-Year Forecast for 2023/24-2025/26 as endorsed by the Finance Committee at its 76th meeting held on 15 November 2022;
- (b) the detailed Programme and Estimates of HKPC for 2023/24 which included the staff establishment for HKPC which was endorsed by the Staffing Committee at its 73rd meeting held on 8 November 2022; and
- (c) the proposed targets for KPIs for 2023/24 as endorsed by the BDC at its 79th meeting held on 15 November 2022.

50. <u>Members</u> received a presentation by with a video shown on the BIZ Expands Easy (BEE) funding portal which was set up as a one-stop integrated platform consolidating information of various government funding schemes for ease of access by SMEs. The portal, which also came with a BEE ePass Service to streamline the application process, had attracted more than 35,000 views since launch in September 2022.

51. said that HKPC had previously arranged sharing sessions for Members on emerging technologies like Industry 4.0 and Metaverse. invited Members to propose topics of interest for HKPC to arrange further sharing sessions to keep Members abreast of the latest developments in relevant areas.
